## **The STEEL CHALLENGE**

The STEEL CHALLENGE is a national shooting organization started in 1981. Just like the IDPA and USPSA/IPSC, the STEEL CHALLENGE has been around for many years. (32 to be exact)

The match is highly spectator friendly and the competition is easy to understand. It is all about the speed and accuracy.

The premise of the match is simple. Each match consists of 6 stages and each stage consists of 5 strings of fire. At the start command, you draw and fire at five stationary targets of varying sizes and distances. Your time is recorded and your slowest time is thrown out.

The STEEL CHALLENGE has a division for .22 pistols which encourages Dads to bring their kids and wives and participate in the sport of shooting.

Steel shooting offers a point of entry to the shooting sports that is far less intimidating than practical shooting. Steel shooting provides an excellent

starting place for young or beginning shooters. It also provides a soft way for those who have begun to suffer the problems associated with ageing a vehicle to remain involved in the shooting sports. All this provides an alternative for those who might otherwise be lost to shooting.

The standard entry fee is \$10.00 for each firearm used.
